Teaching methodologies (including assessment) [Specify the types of assessment and the weights and evaluation criteria]	<p>1 - Teaching methodologies</p> <p>The methodology to be adopted will involve the approach of the various topics through the theoretical exposition by the teachers of the curricular unit, as well as the development of group work by the students, which will mainly consist on the analysis of articles, codes of ethics and international conventions, as well as analysis and discussion of dilemma cases, promoting reflection on the implementation of values and ethical principles in professional practice.</p>									

2 - Period assessment

Students will be assessed on the basis of preparation of an individual essay and the written synthesis of the practical work done in a group to be developed and presented during the lessons. The final grade of the curricular unit will be the result of the weighted average of the written essay (with weighting equal to two and a minimum grade of 9.5) and the average of the group work (weighting equal to one).

3 - Examination assessment

If the students do not obtain the minimum grade of 9,5 values in the continuos assessment they must attend an examination.
