Teaching methodologies (including assessment) [Specify the types of assessment and the weights and evaluation criteria]	1 - Teaching methodologies The methodology to be adopted will address the various themes through theoretical exposition by the teachers of the curricular unit, as well as the development of group work by the students, which will consist mainly of analysis of articles and other materials, analysis and discussion of studies. as well as reflections on practical intervention.										

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The approach of the various themes through the exposition by the teachers of the curricular unit, will seek to lead students to consolidate knowledge that favors and substantiate social intervention, as well as highlight the theoretical perspectives that frame its implementation in practice.

The analysis of articles and other materials will be carried out in order for students to develop skills on social intervention methodologies with individuals and families. For this we use materials and products made available and / or produced under programs and projects.

The discussion of case studies will be based on the analysis of real situations, so that students can implement analysis and evaluation tools to outline the diagnosis and social intervention.

The development of practical group work aims that students can apply knowledge, understand and solve problems in new situations, as well as in different contexts.

Reflections on practice will help students integrate knowledge as well as analyze ways to deal with complex issues, and discuss the implications and responsibilities of their work.

2 - Period assessment

- Teaching methodologies (includes assessment)

The methodology will include theoretical expositions for the transmission of information by the teacher, case studies, group problem solving, reflections and debates.

The final evaluation of each student will be based on the grades of 1 written test lasting 2 hours; a group work on one of the program modules.

The final grade will be the result of the test grade (weighting two), the group work (weighting one). It is a necessary condition to pass the course that the test score is positive and that the written group work is delivered before the end of the semester and presented in a class near the end of the semester, on a date to be scheduled with each group of students.
