1 - Teaching methodologies

The Spanish Language I course will have a total duration of 100 hours, 52.5 hours of classes (45 practical hours and 7.5 theoretical-practical hours), 7.5 hours of tutorial guidance and 40 hours of independent work.

The teacher will explain everything necessary so that the students can use the language, but these will be those who through oral or written exercises, individually or in group, will show daily if they reach the proposed skills.

The autonomous work hours will be for the study and the accomplishment of activities and works, individual and in group, that will be selected, guided and supervised by the teacher.

2 - Period assessment

Teaching methodologies (including assessment)

The evaluation will be continuous and will be done as follows:

- Two written tests (40%)
- An oral test (20%)
- Student work, participation, assistance ... (40%)

At the end of the semester they must submit a portfolio with the works carried out that will be discussed in the oral exam.

Working students will not be required to attend classes but will have to hand in the work that the rest of the students have done. They will also have to take the test, or tests, semiannuals.

3 - Examination assessement

Students who do not approve will have two exams in January / February (normal and recess time) for the first semester disciplines and another two in June / July (normal and recess time) for the second semester disciplines. In these cases the written part of the exam will have a value of 50%, and the oral part of the exam have a value of 50%.
