To ensure the link between theory and practice, practical work will be carried out.
	 2 - Continuous assessment system: Approval of the course unit is obtained with a minimum mark of 9.5, resulting from the completion of: 1 written test (without consultation): 60% 1 practical group assignment (40%): written assignment (30%) and oral presentation (10%)
