Trainees must acquire a greater ability to reflect on the various journalistic areas and contents and understand the different languages, themes, and dynamics of each of the specific areas of journalism. It is intended that students acquire an introduction to institutions, issues and sources of information in each area of specialization; develop their news acumen, being able to identify a story, define its framework, gather information and write a news story; and are able to carry out their journalistic duties and reflect on the nature of their work.
