Learning outcomes  [Description of the overall and specific objectives] [Knowledge, skills and competences to be developed by students]	Provide students with the necessary tools to perform the activity of veterinary nursing in a small animal clinic with regard to the inpatient and emergency services. Students should understand the role of the Veterinary Nurse in the inpatient and urgency / intensive care service, particularly in terms of approaching the urgent patient. They should be able to perform the specific technical acts that are the basis of the daily work in pets' clinic, namely telephone triage and patient arrival techniques, patient monitoring through physical and instrument examination (blood pressure, pulse oximeter, capnography, ECG, etc.), filling in the daily clinical register, vascular access techniques and fluid therapy plans, assisted feeding techniques and nutritional plans, blood transfusion and its derivatives and compatibility tests, wound and performing various dressings, oxygen therapy techniques, organization of the emergency room / emergency room and cardiorespiratory resuscitation maneuvers.
